We share a special concern over the growing number of products that fall under Special duty assessments. Below are useful web sites to help guide you in managing imported product that may fall under a special duty assessment.

Our Federal government maintains a site that claims to list all in force Antidumping and Countervailing orders. The list can be downloaded in various useful formats. The list compiles order in place by Country, Product group and Date of Order.

Our government also maintains a site that lists the scope determinations for special duty orders in effect. There is an important reason to refer to this list. A scope determination defines the specific criteria of product that is included within the special duty order. Often, it also lists similar products that are specifically excluded from the special duty order. Please be aware that while this list is large, we have found that some cases are not listed.
